With impeccable taste (in both performances and pinot), these two have made a name for themselves by reviewing shows and specialty drinks while sipping their way through the experience. We sat down with the dynamic duo for a no-holds-barred Q&A, covering everything from Broadway dream roles to proper theatre etiquette.

Kiki: Absolutely! And we would have all these drinks brought to us by beautiful cabana boys!

Lucy: Oh, and we would do numbers on the beach like... um...like Gidget or a Frankie and Annette movie.

Kiki: Yes. So the songs would be like...
